# November 5th - Guy Fawkes Night

## Who was Guy Fawkes?

They came up with an idea. They rented out a cellar next to the Houses of Parliament and filled it with dynamite. Their plan was to blow it all up when King

He was taken away and tortured for days until he gave up the names of his friends. After being tortured, he could barely write his own signature. His friends were caught and all 8 of them were taken to court before being killed. They were 'hung drawn and quartered'. First they were tied by the neck to a horse and dragged until they died. Next, their bodies were cut up and put on display. The people of England celebrated the King's life that night by making bonfires across the country.

## What do we do on Guy Fawkes Night now?

As people did over 400 years ago, we gather a big pile of wood and light a huge fire known as a bonfire. We make a doll of Guy Fawkes and put him on the fire too. Then we watch firework displays and eat snacks such as toffee apples.
